

Wembley



Today's Visitors

Wembley Football Club was formed in 1946 following the amalgamation of various junior clubs. Nicknamed the 'Lions', they found a home at Vale Farm and have remained there ever since. Entry was immediately made into the Middlesex League and, after finishing a creditable fourth in their first season, they went on to win the championship in 1947-48.

In season 1955-56 they reached the finals of both the London Senior Cup and Middlesex Senior Cup. They also finished runners up in the Delphian League (they were one of the founder members a few seasons previous). In recognition of these achievements they were invited to join the Corinthian League.

The club then moved to the Athenian League in 1963-64 (which had absorbed both the Corinthian and Delphian Leagues). Malcolm Allison & Allen Batsford both spent short spells at the club during this period. Wembley began their first season in the Isthmian League in 1975-76 and narrowly missed out on promotion to the Premier League, finishing in third spot behind St Albans City and Bromley respectively.

In 1980-81 they reached the First Round Proper of the FA Cup losing 3-0 to Enfield at Southbury Road. The Middlesex Charity Cup was won for the first time

in 1982-83 and the Middlesex Senior Cup was won the following season with a 5-1 success over Hendon.

Wembley were forced to leave the Isthmian League at the end of 2005-06 and joined the Combined Counties League for the following season. They narrowly missed promotion by finishing third.

In the 2012-13 FA Cup competition, after agreeing a deal with competition sponsors Budweiser, the club signed several retired professionals under the guidance of Terry Venables. Unfortunately they bowed out after only playing three matches.

After eight years, Wembley's membership of the Combined Counties League was ended by a lateral move to the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division, joining in 2014-15. The closest they came to winning a trophy was in 2016-17 when they finished runners up in the Premier Division Cup losing 1-0 to Hoddesdon Town. They also finished fourth in the league in the same season

Following two curtailed seasons due to Covid-19 and the 2020-21 league re-structure, Wembley were moved back into the Combined Counties League and are currently celebrating their 75th anniversary.

Progress Made...

From the 'dugout'

Good afternoon everyone. An extended warm welcome to all Wembley FC management, players, committee, their travelling fans and also to today's match officials.

As a management team we have rotated our squad wisely over the past few weeks.....using cup games to see players in different positions and rotate where we feel we can. It's not been easy and because of our league position we didn't have the time to build and adjust our squad to what we believe is ready to take us forward. We knew we had to hit the ground running. Fortunately we have moved quickly and the players, committee and fans have been fantastic for us in our first few weeks.

We had two away league games since our home fixture. Two tough sides in Abbey Rangers and Edgware Town....very hard places to go and both top 6 teams. Abbey was a game we feel we definitely should have won. Losing 2-1 isn't a true reflection of the game. After an even first half, the second half was all us and we missed some fantastic opportunities to open the scoring. It was a very positive performance, but lessons learned. Edgware was a different game. They dominated possession and only some excellent saves from



'man of the match' Chris Wing kept us in the game. After going 1-0 down we dug in deep and earned a point in the final few minutes. Ben Wright finishing well on the turn just inside the box.

On the whole, we are very happy with the way we have started. 7 points from a possible 12. It's been a period of change and adjustments, but we feel we are getting there. We still have lots to work on and it's very early days, but we hope to insert a style of play that fans will love to watch. We have some big positives today, having 'Atko' back in goal after an injury, Ryan Stephens also making a return and 'Wrighty' on form in front of goal.

Finally, a special mention to Brett Denham. Our star striker for the last 10 seasons has shown his commitment to the club....even though he has had other clubs come calling every season. Brett recently celebrated his 300th game for Tadley and we would like to thank Brett for his contribution to our successes over the years. He continues to be an important part of what we are trying to achieve.

Thanks to everyone for coming today and we hope you enjoy the game!

Hard Earned Point...

Edgware Town 1 Tadley Calleva 1
Combined Counties League - Premier Division (North)
Saturday 6th November 2021

We made the long journey to North London last Saturday hoping to maintain our recent league form having taken seven points from a possible twelve. Although we lost out narrowly by 2-1 to Abbey Rangers the previous week, the quality of the performance was a positive for the new management team. The big disappointment was our inability to convert a number of excellent scoring opportunities when the game was still level.

A couple of enforced changes had to be made for the Edgware match. In came goalkeeper Chris Wing for the injured Craig Atkinson and Dean Turner made his first league start in place of Brad Neal who was on holiday. In form striker Ben Wright also made a welcome return.

It would be fair to say we didn't make the best of starts in pretty difficult conditions. The poor quality of the artificial playing surface coupled with a strong wind made the first 15 minutes tough going. The home sides quick passing of the football also put us on the backfoot. Only several excellent saves by Tadley keeper Chris Wing kept the scores level during the early stages.

A one handed save from Nile Waite on 5 minutes was particularly impressive which was also acknowledged by the home support.. Tadley's best chance of the first half fell to Brett Denham, but home keeper Michael Anguzu made the crucial save. Connor Thorne also went close, but his first time strike flew narrowly wide of Anguzu's right hand post. On balance, Tadley would have been the happier of the sides going in at the break. (HT 0-0)

The second half was a bit more even with both sides creating good scoring opportunities. The home side went closest when Novell Sony-Bruce's well struck shot cannoned back off the crossbar. However, they didn't have much longer to wait for the opener. Waite's shot from close range was again saved by Wing, but it fell back to Waite to tuck the ball home on 65 minutes.

As time was running out Tadley were awarded a free kick midway into the Edgware half. The home defence failed to deal with Callum Cleary's cross and Ben Wright was on hand to score the equaliser on 89 minutes after a clever turn took him away from Aliou Kamara's last ditch tackle. Deep into stoppage time and we almost came away with all three points only for Andrew Charsley's drive from close range to be excellently saved by Michael Anguzu. However, Tadley's management team were happy to earn a share of the points against a good side. (FT 1-1)

Our midweek match in the North Hants Senior Cup Q/F ended in massive disappointment when we lost out 5-3 to old Wessex League rivals Alresford Town. Three goals in a disastrous 4 minute spell proved to be our downfall. Ben Wright maintained his excellent scoring form with a brace, the other coming from midfielder Callum Cleary.



The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995-96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007-08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010-11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4-1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
