Tadley Calleva Football Club are a football club based in Tadley, Hampshire, England. The club is affiliated to the Hampshire FA.

The club's name of Calleva comes from the nearby Roman Town of Calleva Atrebatum, based just outside Silchester. We currently compete in the Combined Counties League Premier Division South

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was reformed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League.

The club was formed as Tadley F.C in 1989. We joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two. The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon reorganisation.

In 2004, we changed our name again to the present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was renamed Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, we won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as the ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division in 2018-19 season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal was to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field. Tadley finished 8th in their first season.

First, I'd like to extend a very warm welcome to the officials, players and supporters of Badshot Lea Football Club for this Aldershot Senior Cup quarter-final.

We've enjoyed a fruitful couple of fixtures with two very comprehensive wins, against both Epsom & Ewell & Spelthorne Sports. We scored nine goals, conceding only two which saw us go back into sixth and 'Best of the rest'.

REDHILL 5-0 TADLEY CALLEVA

SATURDAY 22ND MARCH | KILN BROW

Tadley Calleva's play-off hopes suffered a blow on Saturday as they lost heavily away from home.

The Romans travelled to face top-of-the-league Redhill, who hadn't lost any of their sixteen home games so far. Manager Joe Lawler made three changes from the 4-0 midweek win over Spelthorne, as Joe Cummiskey, Jordan Goater, and Connor Thorne returned to the starting line-up.

It was a tricky start for Calleva, as the hosts stamped their authority on the match early on with a fifteenth-minute strike from Sean Swift. The first half saw no further goals, but Tadley were well in the game, hitting the post and posing a threat without getting back onto level terms.

At times, they were the better side, holding their own against an imposing Redhill side with 82 goals to their name. In the second period, it became apparent just how the hosts had achieved this record. Charlie Penny scored in the 52nd minute to give Redhill a two-goal cushion, as they threatened to pull out of sight.

Sheldon Wright arrived on the scene, replacing Oliver Rowan, before Dan Williamson replaced Connor Thorne and Samuel Tesfu came on for Goater as Lawler rolled the dice.

This didn't help Tadley get back into the game, however, as Adam Grant made it 3-0 to Redhill with just seven minutes remaining to put the contest to bed.

The action didn't stop here, though, as Redhill turned the screw on their victims.

Eoin Fraser made it 4-0 in the 86th minute before Ethan Ford scored a fifth in the 89th. The 5-0 victory says more about the victors' quality but damages Tadley's play-off chances nonetheless.

Calleva were well in the game at the break, but the hosts' clinical finishing made all the difference.

The mission is clear for Lawler's men. Four games remain, three of them at home. If they can win those, they'll stand a chance at making the play-offs, currently five points out of reach.

Their next test is on Saturday as they host a dangerous Cobham side.

The club was established in 1904, although they only played friendly matches until affiliating with the Surrey County Football Association in 1907. They subsequently played in local leagues before joining the Surrey Intermediate League, winning Division One in 1936–37 and again in 1937–38. They won the division again in 1985–86, earning promotion to the Surrey Premier League. However, they were relegated back to the Surrey Intermediate League the following season after finishing second bottom of the division.

Badshot Lea won the league's Challenge Cup in 1987–88 and the Invitation Cup in 1989–90. They were relegated to Division Two, but won the division in 1992–93. They won the Challenge Cup for a second time in 2000–01. In 2003 they moved up to Division One East of the Hellenic League. They won the Supplementary Cup in 2005–06, and after finishing third in 2006–07 they were promoted to the Premier Division. However, after one season in the Hellenic League's top division, they were transferred to the Premier Division of the Combined Counties League, swapping leagues with AFC Wallingford. Their first season in the Combined Counties League also saw them enter the FA Vase for the first time.

The following season saw Badshot Lea make their debut in the FA Cup, eventually losing 10–0 to Ashford Town (Middlesex) in the second qualifying round. In 2010–11 they won the Aldershot & District Senior Cup, beating Fleet Town on penalties in the final after a 3–3 draw. After finishing in the bottom three of the Premier Division in 2016–17 the club were relegated to Division One. However, they finished third in Division One the following season and were promoted back to the Premier Division. When the Premier Division was split in two in 2021, the club were placed in the Premier Division South. They were runners-up in the division in 2022–23, earning promotion to the South Central Division of the Isthmian League as one of the highest ranked runners-up across the step five divisions. The season also saw them win the Aldershot Senior Cup, beating Westfield F.C. 2–0 in the final
