This was a strange sort of game in many ways as for much of the first half there was very little between the teams with neither goalkeeper seriously tested.

However, in the 40th minute we were awarded a penalty when Brett Denham chased a ball to the right edge of the box and fired in a low cross that was blocked by the hand of defender Michael Johnston. Sam Hamilton stepped up to coolly slot the ball past home keeper Tom Edmonds to give us the lead. From that point on we took total control of the game.

Shortly before the break midfielder Danny Vickers made a great interception and sent Brett Denham clear. Brett made no mistake in neatly tucking the ball home for a 2-0 half time lead.

The second half saw us totally bombard the home goal and a third soon followed when Tom Edmonds poor kick-out was picked up by Alex Charlick in mindfield and his pass sent Sam Hamilton away on the right. Sam whipped in an excellent low cross that was stroked home by Brett Denham at the far post. The returning Adam Alliston came close to opening his account for the season but was denied by a fine

save from Edmonds. However, the fourth duly arrived when Sam Hamilton broke clear to fire home as the Ringwood defence pushed forward.

The fifth came quickly afterward when Scott Kinge delightfully chipped over the keeper from outside of the box - a real gem of a goal. We could have scored a few more as we were undoubtedly the dominant side, but we settled for the five and a great three points against a very dangerous side.

Our defence was excellent on the day and keeper Freddie Gee hardly had a save to make against a side that were the top goalscorers in the Division prior to the kick-off.

Manager Danny Dolan was delighted with his team's response from the previous week's disappointing result at Alton. To score five and keep a clean sheet at Ringwood is a terrific performance.

Romsey Town

Today's Visitors

Our visitors come to Barlow's Park today having climbed to fourth place after their 2-1 victory over Totton & Eling - courtesy of two goals from Wayne Boud. This came on the back of a 6-1 away defeat at AFC Stoneham the previous Saturday. Joint top scorers so far this season are Tom Donaldson and Daniel Fox with nine goals each.

The club was formed in 1886 when a meeting took place at the Town Hall 'to consider the desirability of forming a football team in the town'. Initially they played at Alma Road and in 1889 began playing in local league football where they had successful spells in a number of competitions before joining the Southampton League as founder members in 1908.

The 1920's were a good decade for Romsey Town - after winning the Hampshire Intermediate Cup and the Southampton Senior League they gained entry into the Hampshire League, but struggled in the West Division and returned to local football after one season. In 1930 Romsey moved to Priestlands and returned to the Hampshire League where they were placed in Division 2. The club was better prepared as it went on to produce some of its best attacking sides. In 1956 the club was relegated and moved to its current home - The Bypass Ground.

The club continued in Division 3, but in the early 1960's saw a further decline in fortune, eventually resulting in relegation from the league in 1964. Because the football pyramid was not yet in existence, the club was forced to drop down to replace their reserves in the Junior Division 1 of the Southampton League and it was not until 1968 that they won promotion back into the Senior Section.

By the 1970's, the club started to re-build from lower league football and after three successive promotions and a Southampton Senior Cup triumph in 1974, Romsey regained their Hampshire League status and promptly won the Division 4 title in 1975. Romsey proceeded to end the decade on a high note - again winning promotion and the Hampshire Intermediate Cup in 1978 followed arguably by their finest hour when they won the Division 2 title and defeating Farnborough Town 1-0 in the Hampshire Senior Cup Final at The Dell.

The club finished the 1989-90 season as Wessex League champions, but suffered some up and down seasons which saw them back in the Hampshire League for a short spell before rejoining the Wessex League in 2004.

Good afternoon and welcome to Barlow's Park for today's Sydenhams Wessex League Division One match. A particularly warm welcome is extended to the players, officials and supporters of Romsey Town FC and also to today's match officials.

Manager Danny Dolan will have several players back after missing out last week - so team selection will again prove tricky, but the lads have shown a great attitude and are happy to battle for their place which can only be healthy for the club as we move forward.

The Division continues to spring surprises and interesting results. At the top we now find Andover New Street who saw off Laverstock & Ford 2-1 on

Saturday. Early leaders Laverstock, having taken the league by storm in the open couple of months, have struggled over recent weeks and slipped to fifth place. Christchurch sit in third spot and the two meet in a crunch game this afternoon. Romsey Town have quietly climbed to fourth with the always dangerous AFC Stoneham, whom we visit next week, moving into sixth position following their 3-1 victory over Ringwood Town. Last week's results also saw wins for Alton by 4-0 at home to Whitchurch United, New Milton Town by 3-1 at home to Downton and US Portsmouth who saw off Fawley by 1-0. The remaining result saw the resurgent East Cowes Vics held 1-1 at home by Hythe & Dibden.

Our Reserves picked up a point in a 2-2 draw at home to US Portsmouth last Saturday - goals from Adam Bartlett and Tyrell Reid. They are at home again next week when they welcome Hamble Club to Barlow's Park. Currently the Reserves sit mid-table in ninth position of the Wyvern League.

Manager Danny Dolan was forced to re-arrange his side due to five players being unavailable for a variety of reasons, but no matter, the lads did the job that was required of them and we came home with a very comfortable three points.

We got off to the best possible start with a goal inside the first two minutes. A build up on the left saw Darryl Phillips collect the ball and slip a pass to Danny Vickers who was given far too much time and space enabling him to crack a superb shot under the crossbar.

Just three minutes later and we struck again when Darryl Phillips struck a brilliant pass over the defence which fell perfectly into the path of the onrushing Sam Hamilton who chipped a gem of a shot over the stranded home keeper Bobby Reed.

We continued to push forward looking to increase our lead further and Danny Vickers came close with an excellent turn and shot that clipped the bar and flew over. Scott Kinge also went close with a fine header from a well placed Sam Hamilton free-kick.

The home side offered very little in return, but their defence held firm to ensure that we went in at the break with just a two goal advantage.

The second half once again saw us take complete control and keeper Reed denied Darryl Phillips at the near post following a neat one-two between himself and Connor Thorne. A third goal did appear when Archie Fawcett tucked the ball neatly into the corner of the net after a fine run and pass from Sam Hamilton.

Our keeper, Freddie Gee, was largely untroubled as the defence (which included the returning Andrew Charsley) restricted Folland Sports to the occasional long range effort that flew well wide of the target or over the bar.

The History

In brief

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League.

The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed it's name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd positions in both seasons.

In the 2010–11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4–1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at the Soccer AM Stadium (formerly 'The Camrose') after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had it's best run in the FA Vase last season reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Premier Division. They also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup last season losing out 3-1 to Premier Division side Whitchurch United - again at The Camrose.
